Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

PLEADINGS
Detroit Wings forward Joe Kocur has pleaded guilty to disorderly conduct in connection with an incident involving a Northville woman outside a Farmington Hills dance spot last August.

Farmington Hills city attorney Tim Kenny agreed to drop an assault and battery charge in exchange for the guilty plea, which District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington accepted Tuesday.

Kocur, 24, a West Bloomfield resident, faces a penalty of up to 90 days in jail and a \$500 fine. No sentencing date was set.

Although admitting disorderly conduct, Kocur denies he struck anyone in the parking lot of Mr. Sports One of a Kind, 30860 Orchard Lake Road, Aug. 23.

But the woman, Janet Maschke, 22, filed a civil suit in Farmington's 47th District Court Tuesday in connection with the alleged arm-punching incident. She is seeking damages not to exceed \$10,000.

In a report filed with Farmington Hills police last August, she alleged that Kocur punched her in the upper right arm outside Mr. Sports at 2:15 a.m. Aug. 23, after an argument inside a car accepted by Kocur and three women, including herself.

She was treated for an arm bruise at Providence Hospital, Southfield, following the incident, according to the police report.

SCHOOL BREAK-IN
Farmington Hills police found broken windows in an entrance door and a classroom door after responding to an alarm at William Grace Elementary School, 29040 Shiawassee, early Wednesday.

According to the police report: When police arrived at 3:45 a.m., they found a set of double doors on the school's west side held open by a prybar.

They also found a 1986 Ford Escort, with the key in the ignition, backed up to the boiler room on the school's east side. The hatchback faced an entrance door to the school's northeast wing. The door window was broken. Across the hall-

way was an identical door, its window also broken.

Room 15 had been entered by breaking the door window and reaching in to unlock the door.

Nothing appeared missing from the school.

Police believe the thief left through a door on the school's southwest side when they arrived.

On Friday, police planned to seek a warrant charging a 22-year-old Detroit man with the break-in. The car found at the school was registered to him, said Sgt. Charles Nebus, Farmington Hills Police Department Detective Section supervisor.

The car contained a computer keyboard and monitor, valued at about \$400, that police believe were stolen from a Clarencville school building the morning before, detective Darnel Krause said.

SUSPECT ARRESTED
Farmington Hills police assisted Novi police early Wednesday in arresting a man suspected of a felonious assault earlier that night in Novi.

The 46-year-old suspect was arrested after he drove into the driveway of his southeast Farmington Hills home at 12:45 a.m. Wednesday. He was turned over to Novi police.

A rifle, with a live round in the chamber and 10 live rounds in the magazine, was found in a partially unzipped case on the passenger seat. Seven live rounds were found in his pants pocket, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

WOMAN ARRESTED
A Farmington Hills woman was arrested after a traffic stop when she was found to have a suspended operator's license and to be carrying a concealed knife, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

The 22-year-old woman was stopped on Farmington Road at Eight Mile. A four-inch metal butterfly knife was found in her pocket, according to the public safety report.

THEFTS REPORTED
A television and cash valued at \$108 were reported stolen during a break-in at Hair Sanctuary, 3433 Grand River, Jan. 19-20. Thieves did about \$175 worth of damage.

Six cases of anti-freeze valued at \$548 were reported stolen from the Amoco gas station, 22420 Farmington, Jan. 20-23.

A snowblower valued at \$592 was reported stolen from a garage on Valleydale Jan. 22-26.

Propane vapors ignite; Hills worker burned

An independent contractor working at a house under construction in Farmington Hills was burned when he accidentally ignited liquid propane vapors while trying to light a portable heater in the basement Wednesday.

Samuel Clifford Lane, 30, of Royal Oak was listed in good condition Thursday at the University of Michigan Hospital Burn Center, Ann Arbor.

He sustained face and hand burns covering 9 percent of his body, said Toni Shears, burn center representative.

Lane's partner drove him to Henry Ford Hospital, West Bloomfield. Lane later was transferred to Ann Arbor.

"Firefighters aren't sure if Lane ignited liquid propane vapor from the line running into the basement or from the point where the line connected to the heater," Shears said. "We're still looking at the fire."

said Al Ellis, Farmington Hills Fire Department investigator.

"When he went down to light the pilot, his lighter ignited vapors that had filled the basement," Ellis said. "Witnesses heard a boom."

"Quite a bit of propane must've leaked to cause that kind of problem," he said.

The boom lifted part of the wood flooring off the concrete foundation. Nothing in the basement burned other than some hay, Ellis said.

THE INCIDENT occurred at 1 p.m. Wednesday on Glen Grove, near Halsted and 14 Mile. The heater was used to cure the basement's cement walls.
