

Women's Hall of Fame nominees sought

Nominations for the Sixth Annual Michigan Women's Hall of Fame in the contemporary and historical divisions are now open for 1989. The public is invited to participate in nominating women of honor and distinction who are, or have been, closely affiliated with Michigan by birth

or contribution.

Nomination forms may be requested by writing to Nominations, Michigan Women's Studies Association, 213 W. Main Street, Lansing 48933. Nomination forms are also available by calling (517) 484-1880. Entries must be received by

March 21. Two screening committees review all nominations and rank them by merit after the candidate is accepted as a nominee. The first committee makes a determination of which nominations make the final screening. The second committee decides who will be honored. MWSA assists in the process and makes the announcement of the finalists. Winners will be honored at a dinner in Lansing in October.

There is no limit on nominations. Groups or individuals may nominate candidates. The nominee's achievements and personal history must be documented through the official nomination form. Those honored are selected on the basis of an outstanding career, service or accomplishment and must have an identity associated with Michigan.

The Michigan Women's Hall of Fame presents them with a "Life Achievement Award" and inducts them into the Michigan Women's Historical Center and Hall of Fame in Lansing where the public may learn more about them.

"Sometimes I'm asked why a

worthwhile woman wasn't selected," says Dr. Gladys Beckwith, president of MWSA and executive director of the Women's Hall of Fame. "I simply ask if that individual had been nominated. To be considered, the woman must first be nominated." All nominations are reviewed and considered.

Past honorees include Rosa Parks, Fran Harris, Sarah Goddard Power, Dr. Marjorie Peebles Meyers, Helen Milliken, Genevieve Gillette and Dr. Elizabeth Crosby. They represent achievements in the fields of civil rights, television, radio, education, employment, arts, conservation and anatomy.

ACQUISITION OF A BANK HOLDING COMPANY

Michigan National Corporation, Farmington Hills, Michigan, intends to apply to the Federal Reserve Board for permission to acquire all of the issued and outstanding Class B Common Stock, representing approximately 49% of the voting control of Bloomfield Hills Bancorp., Inc., a new bank holding company located in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan. Bloomfield Hills Bancorp., Inc. is concurrently applying to the Federal Reserve for permission to acquire 100% of de novo bank, The Bank of Bloomfield Hills, which will be located in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan. The Federal Reserve considers a number of factors in deciding whether to approve the application including the record of performance of banks we own in helping to meet local credit needs.
