# Service academy nominees named

U.S. Rep. William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, announced the names of the local nominees who will compete for 1989 appointments to the service academies.

All nominees are selected on a competitive basis as a result of SAT/ACT scores, scholastic record, extracurricular activities, leadership potential, and letters of recommendation.

Under the competitive appointment system used by Broomfield, final appointments to the academies will be made by selection boards at each academy. All appointments will be announced before May 1.

For 1989, 10 nominees will compete for one vacancy at the Air Force Academy, 10 nominees will

compete for one vacancy at the Military Academy, and 10 nominees will compete for one vacancy at the Naval Academy. Merchant Marine Academy nominees compete on a statewide basis for 12 appointments given to Michigan.

Bertha said they must be out of their house by March 1, so will spend February packing and moving to their second home up north.

"I really have enjoyed this work here," Bertha said. "I've just gotten

boarse trying to explain it (their retirement). Some people were crying. I didn't know what to do."

Some regular customers visited Jerry's two to three times a week, while others came in occasionally, but many customers were regulars. Bertha has watched many children grow up, get married and have their own children, she said.

When they moved to their most recent location, the moving was a community effort, aided by customers who cleaned and painted the then-new quarters.



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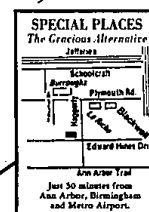
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
