ARRIVES FOR DUTY

BASIC TRAINING

Surplus fund aids cities

The Municipal Worker's Compensation Fund, sponsored by the Michigan Municipal League has returned \$4,700 to Farmington and \$19,900 to Farmington Hills.

This is the 10th consecutive year in which the Michigan Municipal League Fund has distributed surplus to its members. Last year, Farmington got \$1,800 and Farmington Hills got \$9,400.

The non-profit self-insurance fund collects sufficient premium to pay required benefits to injured employees of Michigan governmental units and returns premium and investment income not needed to pay claims and maintain prudent reserves.

The surplus is distributed on a pro rata basis to the members based upon the amount of each member's premium contribution.
