The string orchestra will be conducted by Jacqueline Coleman, director of the middle school music program at Detroit Country Day School. Her group will feature Franz Liszt's Hungarian Rhapsody No. 2 as well as a tribute to Black History Month highlighting famous American Spirituals by Robert Frost.

The concert orchestra headed by Douglas Bianchi, music director at L'Anse Creuse High School North will perform Antonin Dvorak's Symphony No. 9 E Minor, Opus 95 "From the New World". The symphony orchestra is conducted by Alan MacNair, concertmaster of the Rochester Symphony and director of the music program at Troy High School.
