What I had found on my trip was a lovely area
of homes with a southwest look rather than the
stocco facades so prevalent in Florida. The blueprints showed that there had been an addition to
the three-bedroom home to provide another bedroom and more living area.

The furnishings I found were typical of what
years polder eyel. The fooring in the living-dining room of the original house was medium to
light brown oak with dark pegs. Oak flooring
was in the addition, but minus the pegs, since
they were no longer available.

TO GIVE more continuity between the original medium brown oak flooring with dark pega and the flooring in the addition that was minus pega, we stripped the old floor to match the new and had the entire surface whitewashed for a lighter, fresher look.

For a casual area that opens to the pool, we chose an L-shaped wicker sectional upholistered in a marshmallow soft leather in a putty color. Throw pillows covered in fabrics used in the room are scattered on the sofa.

A xebra ruja tunder the coffee table, which is a glass top on a fossil stone bass. A custom-built eabilite thouses a 40-inch TV screen and stereo, and the open shelves are used to display art collected from travels.

In the more formal living room, there is now a contemporary L-shaped sectional covered in a seafoum blue/green fabric. Again we used throw pillows covered in fabrics used in other parts of the room.

On the glass coffee table, 50 inches in diame-ter, is a magnificent teak carving of a water buffalo with Chinese children. Like many of the Oriental accessories, this was bought in main-

Forming a conversational grouping around the table are three Louis XV stripped oak armchairs covered in a handpainted palstey cot-ton in seafoam green, peach, mauve and soft plum.


IN THE dining room, we replaced the chande-lier with recessed lighting over the table. By eliminating the chandelier we were able to use a tall, antique, Oriental vase as the centerpiece. The table, 40 by 80 inches, is filled travertine marble.

The chairs that go with it are Chinese Chippendale in a soft plum lacquer finish, covered in a strie pattern of the colors used. A glass wall shelf serves as a buffet.

A nook at the side of the living room has a full bar with stools in pewer with revolving seats covered in peachest and cream ultra sued, because in the same stor a fliptop burl mahogany game table in the same nook are covered in the same strie fabric as the dining room chairs.

Facing the bar is a hideaway sofa upholstered in the same peaches and cream tone, with back cushions of a watered moire of the colors in the room.



The sea foam greens and mauves are relaxing colors and there's an informal feeling to the wicker sectional. Yet, taken as a whole, this glimpso of a Florida vacation home done by Eve Garvin has a sleek look that will move it comfortably into the next decade.
