"The strongest market segments in the next 12 months will be for unsin the next 12 months will be for ups-cale condominiums, high-tech indus-trial space, and retail space, particu-larly in neighborhood and strip cen-ters," said Eckenstabler, He described the Oakland County and I-696 market areas as "dynamic." The report projected some soften-ing in apartment and hotel construc-tion.

I-696 will stretch east-west across the suburbs north of, Petroit. The missing link," through the Royal Oak-Southfield 'area, is due to be completed this fall after delays totalling 25 years.

JACK DRINER, the county's coordinator of the study, said growth management in outlying communities will be an incentive for developers and investors to take a more careful look at central and mature areas.
