In 1981, a tire came off a school bus and bounced into their back yard. Four years ago, a car carrier jumped the guardrail, skidded and lid down an embankment to the edge of the divider fence, 50 feet from their house.

They're intended "to keep vehicles from rolling over or bitting a major obstruction," Strakovits said.

In this case, the guardrall contained the truck while near the overpass and a sharp dropoff.

But guardralis aren't meant to just contain, "if so, all freeways would be continuously lined with them," Strakovits said.

"It's certainly unreasonable to expect a guy not to stop in that length of time (two-tenths of a mile). I don't know what else we could've done to prevent this," he said.
"Two-tenths of a mile away is well into what we consider the clear zone, according to highway engineering requirements," Montes said.
Variables considered in determining guardrail length include the degree of the slope bestide the freeway, the geometries of the roadway and potential obstructions (a bridge, a creek, a sign truss).

"Without knowing all the variables in this case, it'd be hard to say what would be required. But obviously, with every piece of guardrail, we look at the road conditions and determine what's necessary," Montes said.

According to David Allyn, director of traffic #firly for the road coins mission, an estimated 800 feet of roadway will require paving. A central for left turns will be added north of 14 Mile on Drake. It will be allgoed with the center lane south of 14 Mile.

Confusion over the issue access last.

Confusion over the issue arose last week when road commission spokes-man John Joy said installation of the traffic signal had nothing to do with paving. He later clarified his com-ments.

ments.

Installation of the signal may be initiated whether or not paving has been completed. However, the signal will not be activated until paving is complete.

Therefore, Joy said, "commissioner approval of the project is not tied paving. But I did not make myself clear. I toke full responsibility" for the confusion, be said. the confusion, he said

THE SIGNAL was proposed over a year ago by West Bloomfield and Farmington Hills officials because of the increasing number of traffic accidents at the site. Total accidents increased from four in 1985, 13 in 1986, 14 in 1987 to 17 last year. Of the total number, there have been two fatalities and multiple personal injuries, according to Robert DeCorte of the Oakland County Traffic Improvement Association.

County where there have been five or more traffic accidents, the inter-section at 14 Mile and brake ranks 513, based upon figures supplied by the Michigan State Police, DeCorte

the Michigan State Police, Decorte said.

So far this year, there have been three accidents at the site, two on the same day. One was the fatal accident in which Holly Pawl, a fourty grader at Yun Beach Elementary, died from head injuries after being thrown from a Jeep that had been struck in the left rear while crossing 44 Mile.

West Bloomfield police are still inwest Boominea poince are stain restigating the accident, which because it involved a fatality also requires review by the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office. Alcohol was not involved, according to West Bloomfield police, and preliminary investigation suggested there was no excessive speed.

THE INCIDENCE of accidents at the interesection is unlikely to decrease with installation of the new signal, according to DeCorte, but it is likely the type of accident will:

is likely the type on accountable, change.

"The primary reason for a signal is to safely increase traffic capacity at an intersection. A signal nearly climinates the more serious, broad-side accident but it creates more rear-end accidents that are less serious. It's a trade-off," DeCorte said.


