

Borgess selects Fusco at its AD

Miko Fusco will be wearing a couple of hats at Redford Bishop Borgess High.

A computer teacher and head boys basketball coach the past seven years, Fusco also will assume responsibilities as athletic director.

Borgess principal Sister Joan Chazley named the 33-year-old Fusco as the school's new athletic director on Monday, succeeding Fred Musinski, who stepped down last month after he violated school procedures when he prematurely announced the hiring of former Detroit Public School League coach Ernest Thomas as the school's new football coach.

Fusco said that his top priority is working with the search committee to name a new football coach within two weeks.

"That's the first thing that has to be done," Fusco said. "We need somebody good for Bishop Borgess."

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It's hard to say whether a teaching position will be tied in. "The applications closed on Feb. 15, and we'll begin to take another look at the candidates. Sister Joan has the final say."

FUSCO SAID he is looking forward to his new duties. "I think I have an idea about what Borgess is all about," he said. "I like the idea and challenge, and hopefully directing their vision."

"I've worked closely with both Fred Musinski and Ralph Owen (the former athletic director), and I have a good feel for the job. It also helps that I've been a varsity coach here and also three years at Detroit St. Hedwig."

"I know the people in the Catholic League, as well as all their support people."

"Although I'm inexperienced, I have some experience for the job."

Fusco has other priorities, including ways to increase participation at the lower levels.

"We want to have freshman football, baseball, girls basketball and volleyball for starters. And getting the soccer programs back is also a possibility."

Fusco said his schedule will not change until next year. "I will continue to teach, and I hope I can continue because I enjoy being in the classroom."

Mayor Sever opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on February 27, 1989 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Mayor Sever, Mayor Pro Tem Fox, Arnold, Marks, and Vaguzzi. Members absent: Soronen. Council adopted assessment roll for Salem Road (north of Village Lane) and Village Lane (west of Valley Road) water main project, S.A.D. C-211 (Resolution No. 5).

Council approved use of funds for 1988/89 Community Development Block Grant Program.

Council approved Arboretum access onto Drake Road for northbound traffic only and will request Oakland County Road Commission to allow installation of a traffic signal at White Plains and Twelve Mile Road.

Council approved request from Drake Road residents Citizens Committee for various traffic regulatory actions on Drake between Eleven and Twelve Mile Roads.

Council denied request of B. G. Bones, Inc. for Class C Liquor License with Entertainment Permit.
