Art from an Irish monument older than Sto-nehenge or the Great Pyramids will be the sub-ject of a program by Martin Cullen at 2:30 p.m. Sunday at the Parks and Recreation Bullding, Southfield Civic Center, 26000 Evergreen, South-

Cullen will show color sildes of his etchingt taken from carvings on the 5,000-year-old tomb at Newgrange, Ireland, and discuss the mysteri-ous civilization that built and decorated it and other structures in the Boyne Vailey.

The tomb is a 62-foot long passage ending in a large chamber that was probably used for relig-ious ritual. The stone walls and ceilings of the passage and the chamber are carved in beautiful patterns of circles, spirials and triangles. Cullen will explain the technique for making his trac-ings of this without damaging the fragile stones. Callen has a civil engineering degree from Ire-land's National College of Art and Design, the Royal Hoerian Academy of Arts and the Gun Graphic Arts and Etching Studio in Dub-lin.
