State GOP booster supports 'new breeze'

Jim Hall, second vice chairman of the Michigan Republican Party, wants to be a vital part of President George Bush's "new breeze."

He has been active in the party since 1979 because, he maintains, "The Republican philosophy more accurately reflects reality."

Hall, 31, of Southfield, said "the new breeze blowing" in the Bush administration addresses civil rights as a top agenda item. The Republican Party is the party of opportunity, he said.

"I'VE BEEN around the party for 10 years, and I guess I've been recognized for paying a lot of dues," he said.

"My experience as legislative district coordinator for the Republican Committee of Oakland County, Bush for President chairman of the 17th District and director of the Southfield GOP helped into great support."

As a state officer, Hall defines his role as outreach to the minority community and getting the message out to expand the base of the Republican Party in the black community.

"I never stopped being a Democrat," he said. "The Democratic Party left me. My parents were Democrats, but they always taught me to be objective."

"I was a Democrat until 1978,

when I arrived at the decision that Republicans are more aligned with my values of equal opportunity, the work ethic and promotion of the individual through opportunity, not social programs."

Hall, who for five years was a general agent for AAA, now has his own AAA agency in Farmington Hills.

Blacks fare better under Republican administrations, he maintains.

Despite this, he said, he wishes the Reagan administration would have taken a more aggressive position on civil rights. But he has every confidence that both Barbara and George Bush will be different.

"My purpose in being a Republican, isn't to bash Democrats," Hall said.

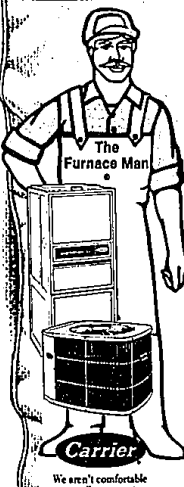
