"It's an inconvenience when the siren sounds, especially at an early hour, but it doesn't happen often," Robinson said, noting only one other false sounding in southern Toakhand County this year.
She said the Federal Communications Commission "is supposed to keep on eye on what frequencies people are using to avoid overlap," Sometimes, she said, "frequencies are oftenough to overlap."
