Bouring tip of the week: This is from Girl Richardson, professional instructor at Strike & Spare. The thumb hole in your bail can create problems for you. If the bole is too tip tit—and this can develop while you are bowling a game — you can help yourself out of the dilemma by a basing a regular handkerphic, attick your thumb in it.

This actually will compress the thumb and allow you to continue bowling. The opposite problem is a thumb or finger hole that is too loose. If that is the case, for strip so I tape will do the job. It is best to use bowler's tape (sold af bowling shops) rather than medical or electrical tape, as either of these will leave a sticky residue when removed later on. If your thumb hole is too loose or too tight, it is difficult to get a proper release.


