Fogel, a radio personality at WJR in Detroit, has turned over his soccer coaching duties at Farmington Hills Mercy to Henry Kilmes, a 1932 Mercy to Henry Kilmes, a 1932 The only caseh in the five-year history of the sport at Mercy, Fogel gave up the post this year after being named afternoon news anchor at WJR.

Mercy finished 13-5-1 in 1988 and won a district champlorship, Fogel was 55-19-6 in his career, and he's confident Kilmes can continue that success.

"TLL MISS it tremendously," said Fogel, who was given an option to return next year if his WJR duttes canable him. "I've got mixed emotions about leaving. I'm having to sacrifice a soccer team, but that's why I'm so pleased to find Henry. He's a handson coach, an excellent player and a real positive type. "I don't know if the girls were shocked or disappointed, but they've got a great coach now and they'll play great for him." Klimes has no warstly head coaching experience, but last fall be guider Redford Catholic Central's jusion varsity and assisted CC's former varsity coach Paul Scieluna.



Klimes was a defensive specialist when he played at Schoolcraft College in 1983-84. Klimes is working on an accounting degree at Wayne State, and he said he's always wanted a varsity head coaching challenge.
