The AIDS test was conducted on the woman tested for the AIDS virus as a precautionary measure, because she had lived in various parts of the country during the past 10 years. She continues to live with her parents in Farmington for a short time.

"We don't know where she's been; we don't know who she's had contact with," Goss said. "In talking with her, we know she's had some good times and some bad times. It's better than sorry."

The city had asked Clinton Valley Center officials to do the blood tests, but state officials refused, saying a blood test would infringe upon the patient's rights.

Farmington city attorney John Doucette said he was researching legal precedent before filing any petitions in court.

"We haven't found anything yet," he said. "We're just treadin' on some new ground."

Goss stressed that the incident was not stress-filled, even though it was lengthy.

field Township and Novi, have supported the connector road, which would be built west of Haggerty Road through the communities of Novi and Commerce Township.

A Michigan Department of Transportation spokesman said more time is needed to learn from interpreted federal agencies, including the Fish and Wildlife Service and the Environmental Protection Agency. The cooperative effort should shorten overall study time by ad-

A public hearing on the draft statement will be scheduled for early June, according to information from the MDOT. The department plans to take bids on the first construction contract late this year.

The project calls for improvements in the Haggerty Road corridor from the I-96 and U-275 interchange north to Pendleton Trail, relieving traffic congestion by providing access to the state freeway system.
