Edison warns of utility rebate scam

A utility rebate is delivered right to your door by two people claiming to be employees of the utility. What do you do? Let them in? Or check them out?

Spring is the season when con artists are likely to show up in your nelghborhood, so Detroit Edison cautions you to be particularly careful about admitting people into your home.

nome.

A common scam that has been used on metro Detroiters involves two imposters who claim they are utility employees delivering a rebate

to the customer. The object of the scam is to gain entry into the home to determine where the residents keep their money. One parher distracts the victim while the other robs the home. "Several elderly persons have been victimized by that scam," according to Richard Dungy, director of security for Derboit Edison and a retired 25-year veteran of the Deriot Folice Department. Detroit Edison employees wear their identification prominently and rarely travel in pairs, Dungy said.

"Two people appearing at the door should be an indication that you should be careful."

The rebate scam is just one of several con games used to get into the home.

To avoid being victimized, follow these three simple guidelines before admitting anyone into your home and know the people who serve you.

Ask for ider-lication. Before admitting any Detroit Edison employee into your home, check from the foreign tending the proper idealification. All Detroit Edison employees carry indentification cards or badges displaying their photos, and clearly labeled as De-
