Pool firm still plans to move to WB

A local businessman's plans to move his Farmington Hills-based pool construction firm into best and the following the following

Farmington Hills by July or August, needs to have his plans approved by the planning commission before construction can begin. He also needs special approval from the city's zōning board of appeals to build nearer to a property line than township rules allow.

"What we're trying to figure out is if we're on the right track and if the city (township) wants us," he said. "But we're going to ride it out. We want to move there."

BECAUSE OF the ane constraints, the project, which would involve building a 15,000-square-foot

warehouse on the 2.9-acre site, carlier was granted an exemption from a township moratorium prohibiting limited industrial development. The planning commission decided not to to grant tentative approval to Robertson's site plan at its March 28 meeting because of a lack of input from Consumers Power officials regarding two high-pressure gas lines that run under the site, according to Fred Rowe, the commission's chairman.

Walter Nussbaum, who represented Paddock Pools at the meeting, said gas company officials objected to any plan for a solid covering over the lines, which run below an area

where a parking lot is planned. He said gas company officials would al-low only gravel covering above the lines and showed the commissioners a plans for a mostly paved parking lot with gravel strips running diago-nally through it.

WITHOUT FIRST hearing from Consumers Power, the commission, with the exception of commissioner Louis Basso, voted not to approve the plan. Basso said that he would support the plan that Nussbaum pre-sented.

Rowe said the commissioners may also ask for a covered structure to house the firm's heavy vehicles before approving the site plan. Robertson said that if the planning commission doesn't approve the site plan he will be forced to move that the site's existing facilities, which, he said, are not nearly as nice as what he proposes to build. "We're going to take the steps required by the township and, hopefully, when its all over and done with, we'll be residents of West Bloomfield," Robertson said.


