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condition. Keep In mind that it is easier to eliminate weeds on your property when they are small, said Lee Taylor of Michigan State University. Weed seedings can be cut off with a hos-while they are more difficult to con-trol as they grow larger. Mulching

also helps control annual weeds. Perennial weeds should be elimi-nated before the garden is planted by killing the underground parts, usually with herbicker. Tsylor sold weeds shouldn't be allowed to ma-ture and go to seed — that multiplies the problem.

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
