## Dermatologist offers free skin cancer tests

Free examinations to check for skin cancer will be offered at the Farmington Hills Health-O-Rama April 12. To promote the early detection and proper treatment of skin cancer, Farmington Hills dermatologist Jon Blum, will do the skin cancer examinations. These examinations will take place from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Mercy Conference Center on 11 Mile Road, east of Middlebelt. Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer. It is more common than cancer of the lung, breast, uterus or any other area. Dermatologists

are medical doctors who specialize in the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of skin problems. Anyone attending the Farmington Hills Health-O-Rama can receive a free, painless examination for possible skin cancer, and also free brochures which discuss the prevention of skin cancer, sunburn, wrinkles and premature aging of the skin. This will be the fourth year that Dr. Blum is offering the free skin cancer examinations at the Mercy Center Health-O-Rama. Most Health-O-Rama sites in other areas do not offer skin cancer screening.
