East student to compete

East Middle School student Josh Prentice is one of approximately 100 students to compete in Michigan's first National Geography Bee April 7 at Central Michigan University in Mount Pleasant.

The state bee is the second level of a national competition sponsored by the National Geographic Society. Students in grades 4-8 are orally tested on geographic knowledge.

More than 600 Michigan schools participated in preliminary bees in January. Winners of the preliminary round took a written qualifying test, students to compete in Michigan's first National Geography Bee in Washington, D.C. The top 104 scorers in Michigan advanced to the state bee.

The winner of Michigan's bee will receive \$100 and an all-expenses-paid trip to the national finals in Washington, D.C., May 18-19. The national champion will receive a \$25,000 college scholarship.
