DRUEN IS the former vice president for Aging Services with Bon Secours Health System of Michigan, a Catholic health care system providing acute and long-term care services.



Mayor Sever opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on April 10, 1989 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Mayor Sever, Mayor Pro-Tem Fox, Arnold, Soronen, Sowerby, and Vagnoni. Members Absent: Marks. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Dorman, Assistant City Manager Call, Director of Planning and Community Development Countegan, and City Attorney Ribeau.

City Clerk Dorman administered oath of office to new Council member Paul Sowerby.

Council approved the Agenda and Consent Agenda, as amended.

Mayor Sever proclaimed April 18-April 30, 1989 as a period of observance of the commemoration of the inaugural journey of George Washington as first President of the United States of America.

Council adopted S.A.D. Resolution No. 3 for road improvement for Parker Street and Robinson Avenue and Resolution No. 6, Notice of Intent to Issue Bonds.

Council granted final approval of Preliminary Plat for Sinacola Woods.

Council confirmed appointment of Andrew Hallie to the Board of Zoning Appeals.

Council postponed consideration of request of Marriott Corporation for a new full year Class B Hotel license with Sunday Sales to April 24, 1989.

Council approved request for transfer of Class C liquor license from Jean Flecker (J.R.'s Bar & Grill) to J. Robert Langau (Robyn's, Inc.).

Council approved purchase of new PC RTV Vote Ballot Tabulation System Equipment in the amount of \$46,500.00.

Council denied request of Optimum Development, Inc., for waiver of storm water retention requirements for the Farmington Woods Condominium project, Section 34.

Council awarded bid for tabulation of Citizen Attitude Survey results to Research One, Inc., in the amount of \$9,000.00.

Council approved Resolution, authorizing grant application for recycling facility (Solid Waste Consortium) and set joint Consortium Member City Councils Meeting for May 17, 1989.


