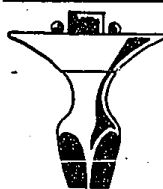

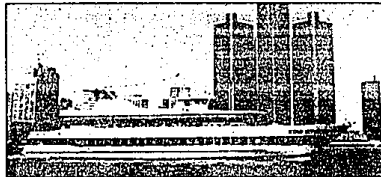
Kite festival ready

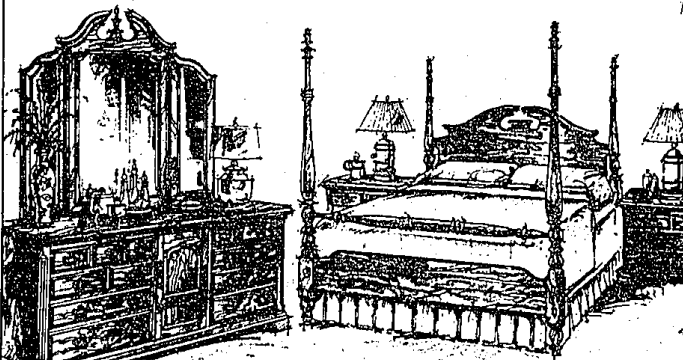
