Recyclable waste products include newspaper, corrugated cardboard, office paper, mixed paper, plastics, glass, metal and bulky wood. Residual, commercial and industrial recycling programs would be established. The transfer station operation will also include facilities or receive and transport compost materials such as leaves and grass clipplings.

In applying for the grant, the consortium must commit to procuring recycled materials by specific dates, separating waste materials for recycling, probibiliting burning leaves, banning leaves and yard waste from landfills and probibiliting the scavenging of recyclable materials.

Cities also are required to educate the public and promote citizen in volvement in separating materials.


