**CITY OF FARMINGTON**  
COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS  
(Summary)  
A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Tupper at 8:00 p.m. on April 17, 1989, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.  
PRESENT: Campbell, Harrisock, Richardson, Tupper, Yoder.  
OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Desdian, Director Lauboff, Director Billing, City Attorney Donohue, Aides, Assistant Schools, City Clerk Bushey.  
Minutes of the previous meeting of April 3, 1989, were approved as corrected.  
Council held a Public Hearing on a Special Exception Permit for a Child Day Care Center in the Central Business District. The proposed use of 33119 Grand River was approved, pending State of Michigan approval of the site, licensing of the operators, and conformance with all City Ordinances.  
A Certificate of Appreciation was awarded to Reserve Officer Charles Zimmerman for outstanding service from 1974 through 1988.  
Minutes of other Boards were received and/or filed.  
Council granted a sign variance to Mark Sklar, 33100 Grand River.  
Council granted approval to C & P Curbside Painting to paint house addresses on curbs with the permission of the property owners.  
Council supported the City of Detroit's resolution opposing Senate Bill 239 which would infringe on local home rule.  
Council granted the requested sign variance to Uptown Farmington Business Association to replace the Shopping Center Entrance ground sign with an Uptown Plaza Entrance ground sign.

Council appointed Richard B. Gundlach to a 3-year term on the Farmington Historical Commission.
