Serial rape suspect seeks psychiatric exam

¹ The former West Bioomfield resident accused of being Oakland County's ski-masked serial rapist wasts to be evaluated by a psychiatrist. "Basically, he's asying, 'Look, there's something wrong with me,' 'said Bingham Farms attorney Lawrence Kalmay, repre-senting Steven A. Szeman Jr., 25, of Rocky River, Ohio.

Szeman faces 49 counts of rape, robbery Szentani Iaces 49 counts of rape, robbery and burglery involving 10 women in Farm-ington Hills, West Bioomfield, Birrningham, Bioomfield Township and Independence Township in late 1997 and spring 1988.
Oakland County assistant prosecutor John Slevin confirmed Tuesday that Oak-land County Circuit Jodge Robert Templin will rule on Kalumy's motion Wednesday, Nay 3. Kalumy is axing that an independ-ent psychiatrist be appointed to evaluate Steman. Kalumy said ho is asking the court is appoint Dr. Sail Forman of Southfield. "My position is that I can't advise him what to do until I exhaust all potential de-fenses," sold Kalumy, a Farmington Hills resident.

THE CHIEF psychiatrist for the Cuyaho-ga County Court of Common Pleas in Cleve-land declared Szeman sane at the time of the November rape of a Cleveland woman and that he was fit to stand trial.

Seeman atood mute and not-guilty pleas were enlared on his behalf when he was ar-raiged by mail in Oakland Comp was rul-Court Tureday on the 40 counts of rape, rob-bery and burglary. "In this case, there was no reason to bring him into court and stand mute," Kalumy said. Szeman is being held to "County - "C

Kalumy said. Szeman is being held in the Oakland County Jali in lieu of a \$7.9 million cash bond. Circuit Judgo Robert Templin has not scheduled pre-trial exams on the charges, Kalumy said. "I don't think Steve (Szeman) wants to go

bonucleic acid (DNA) evidence. DNA is an organic substance used by investigators to analyze body listues, which provide a genet-ic fingerprint. Szeman waived his right to preliminary examinations in 47th District Court in Farmington, 48th District Court in Bioem-field Township and 52nd-5cond Division District Court in Clarkston the week of April 16-14.

It convicted in Oakland Courty, Szeman would be expected to return to Ohio to begin serving his 58-to-140-year sentence in the Chillicoto Correctional Institution, a maxi-num security prison near Columbus. He could be particle there in 10 years and, II convicted here, would begin any Oakland County sentence then.

linked Szeman, an Ohio trash hauling com-pany salesman who once held jobs in Troy and Southfield, to several local attacks through ingerprints found on a Farmington Hills victim's wallet, blood-semen samples Hills victim's water, processence sample and personal property found in his posse sion that belonged to some of the victims.

A wallet, purse and undergarmets be-longing to the last Parmington Hills victim were found April 2, 1988, in a dumpster in Westiake, Ohlo, 3% milles from Szeman's Rocky River townhouse.

He had moved to the Ohlo townhouse from a rented room in West Bloomfield where he lived for approximately two years. The last Oakland County victim was attacked March 31, 1988, in her Farmington Hills home.
