FURNITURE AND FLOOR polishes sometimes contain petroleum distillates, which can cause a form of chemical pneumonia; and acrosols which cause inhaling of these solvents. vents. Alternatives:

- murpny's Oil Soap (contains no phosphates only vegetable oil).

• Mineral oil and a clean cloth.

• Homemade polish: Melt one tablespoon carnaube wax into two cups of mineral oil. Use on furniture and floors,

TOILET BOWL and drain cleaners account for about 10,000 injuries each year in the United States. Most liquid bowt cleaners contain hydrogen chloride which is bighly consiste. Granular bowl cleaners contain sodium bisulfate, which when combined with water becomes correstive to body tissues. Toxic fumes can

cause pulmonary irritation. In-the-tank toilet cleaners usually contain borax which has a very low toxicity, but the cleaning results are not the

best.
Alternatives:

• Liquid "soft-scrub" type cleaners and a tollet bowl brush will rub away mineral deposits. Disinfecting is only necessary when a family member has an intestinal disease.
