Mercy beats rival Marian

Kristyn Schulkins continued her golfing excellence Thursday, leading Farmington Hills Mercy to its fourth dual-match win in five outings, 291-233 over Birmingham Marian.

Schulkins, only a freshman, earned her third straight medalist honor, carding a 95 against the Catholic League opponent at Glen Oaks Golf Club.

She was snapped a six-season winless streak for Mercy against the Mustangs.

Junior Renee Lossia shot 57 for Mercy, while senior Bridget Burke was the other Merit breaking 60, scoring 59. Other scores came from juniors Sue Brighton and Anne Bonczak, who carded 63 and 64, respectively.

A overall mark slipped to 2-2. Mercy was a triangular meet Wednesday at Springdale Golf Club, recording 293 to finish ahead of Birmingham Seaham (304) and Bloomfield Hills Andover (333).

Schulkins again led the way with 52, followed by Lossia and Burke, 56; Brighton, 60; and freshman Jeanne Lossia, 63.

Athens coasts to victory in Oakland County meet

Troy Athens expected to have the county's best girls golf teams this spring. The Red Hawks proved it resoundingly Tuesday.

Athens placed three golfers among the top dozen performers and easily captured the ninth annual Oakland County girls golf title with a 423 team score at the Pontiac Country Club. Bloomfield Hills Kingswood placed a surprising second at 442, followed by West Bloomfield (458), Rochester (459), Bloomfield Hills Lahser (462) and Farmington Hills City of Mercy (463).

It was the second county title for Athens, the last coming in 1986. The Red Hawks placed second the last two years to Birmingham Marian.

"We've shot better scores in previous years, but it was a difficult day to play today," said Athens coach Hans Peterson. "I thought we probably had one of the strongest teams in the area — we kind of expected to win it."

The players teed off in a monstrous morning rain storm, including a small hail storm, under cold conditions. Sunshine greeted golfers by midday and the players exited the course in late afternoon in short-sleeve-type spring weather.

INDIVIDUALLY, CARRIE NOSANCHUK, who won the No. 3 flight state Class B tennis championship last fall, shot rounds of 51 and 44 for a low-medalist score of 95. Nosanchuk did not make any birdies but did card five pars en route to victory.

"It's hard to believe. I expected to be a medalist if I played well, but I didn't expect to win," said Nosanchuk.

"The first nine holes I was hitting the ball well, but my putting wasn't going well. On my back nine my putting was going a little better and I was feeling a lot more confident."

"I was on the last green and had to putt for a par, and just before I shot I heard someone say that Katie (Podlesak of Rochester Adams) had a 96 and someone else said Kara (Packwood of Troy Athens) shot 97. I knew I had to make my putt to make 95 so it was kind of a pressure putt," she said.

Nosanchuk, Podlesak and Packwood were all just one shot apart. Podlesak wasn't particularly pleased with her round of 50-46, while Packwood, a senior who golfed with Podlesak, was one stroke back at 52-45.

The other individual Red Hawk scorers were sophomore Drea Wieme at 101, Sook Kim at 110 and Lisa Weiss at 115.

"We came into this year knowing we had Kara and Drea as our top two golfers," said Peterson. "We were kind of looking for that third golfer. It looks like Sook, a sophomore, has kind of filled that spot."

Kingswood, teammates Sandy Tsai and Lucy Kim tied at 114 while Sue Kim carded a 119.

"This might be the first girls golf trophy we've ever received at Kingswood," said coach Ed Vandam. "And we're delighted."

"All of our players have been on the team for several years and they're all getting better. I thought we could be a fairly good team. We have good team balance and basically that's what got us into second place today."

"I didn't really expect us to finish that high," he said.

Rochester junior Angela Ford tied Wieme with a 101 while Lahser's Katie Shannon was a couple strokes back at 103. Stacy Walden (Rochester), Dana Kevighan (West Bloomfield), Kristyn Schulkins (Mercy), Buffy Seymour (Marian) and Nicole Charboneau (Andover) were the other top dozen golfers.

The Pontiac Country Club course played with slick greens, according to most golfers, and that was partly responsible — along with the volatile morning weather — for the higher scores. Peterson also believes girls golf in general is down this season.

"Oakland County golf is not as strong this year as it has been in the past," said Peterson. "It's just one of those down cycles."

But the Red Hawks showed they are best.

Marlins improve upon '88 finish in county golf

Farmington Hills Mercy moved up to sixth place in the annual Oakland County girls golf tournament Tuesday at Pontiac Country Club.

The Marlins, who finished eighth last year, were led by freshman Kristyn Schulkins, who shot an 18-hole score of 109 on the par-72 course and received a medal for her ninth-place finish.

Schulkins and teammate Sue Brighton, who was 19th out of 70 contestants with a 118 total, were playing in their first 18-hole tournament as varsity golfers.


Bridget Burke and Renee Lossia, both veterans of the county tournament, shot 115 and 121, respectively. Burke was 16th overall.

"I know Burke, Brighton and Lossia were disappointed," Mercy coach Vicki Kowalski said. "They're all capable of 110 and if they had shot that we would have come in second and gotten a trophy. They were real upset about that."

"It rained in the morning, and the scores got better after the rain stopped. The weather didn't help any."

Mercy finished one point out of fifth place, which went to West Bloomfield with a 462 team score. Troy Athens was first (423), Kingswood second (442), Rochester third (451) and Birmingham Groves fourth (459).

"We knew we had a chance to win a trophy and get three medals," Kowalski said. "But we still came back with one medal and improved on what we did last year."


