From arrest to final disposition, a asse moving through our criminal ustice system may take just a few weeks, or many months or years, to se decided.

What can a person arrested and charged with a felony crime expect from the court system? Last week, we focused on the details of the arrest procedure. Following is gener-

court:

• At your arraignment, you can request the court appoint an attorney to represent you. At some later time, you may be required to pay for

time, you may be required to pay for the attorney fees.

There will be a preliminary hearing, or examination, on your case in 47th District Court in Farmington; you should be represented by an attorney. This hearing is usually preceded by a meeting between your attorney and the prosecutor. It is during this meeting that a decision is made as to whether your case will go to trial or you will be offered a chance to plead to a reduced charge, commonly called a "plea bargaining."

During the preliminary exami-nation, the prosecutor has the obliga-tion to convince the court there is probably cause to believe the crime

was committed, and that you are the person who committed the crime. Witnesses or victims will testify at the exam. You will be able to cross-examine them and may testify on vary ours behalf

the exam. You will be able to cross-examine them and may testify on your own behalf.

• If the Judge believes the pro-secutor has proven there is "proba-ble cause," you will be ordered to stand trial in Oakland County Circuit Court. In circuit court, you will be arreaged on charges brought from 4th District Court and will be asked to pleast guilty or not guilty or to see If you decide to have a trial, you may request that a jury hear the case or that it be heard only by the judge, who will determine your guilt or innecence. At the trial, the pro-secutor must prove your guilt be-yond any reasonable doubt. If found guilty by trial, or if you plead guilty, the judge will or for presentence investigation and evalu-ation. They will look lato your back-ground, your employment status,

your living conditions, then evaluate the information as it relates to sentencing.

• In court prior to sentencing, victims will be allowed to comment on the possible sentence, and the court will allow you to speak or have character witnesses speak on your behalf.

character witnesses speak on your behalf.

Sentencing could include time in the Oakland County Jail of up to one year, or a term in a state prison. You may be placed on probation and have to pay fines, court costs, restitution and serve community service.

You have the right to appeal the court decision if you are found guilty. The appeal may take months or years to come before another court, during which time you may be in jail or released on bond at the discretion of the court.

WHILE FACING criminal charges, you have a number of rights. All are contained in the Constitution and are too numerous to mention, but here are a few:

You do not have to make any incriminating statement that can be used against you later.
 You have the right to be represented by a lawyer, even if you cannot afford to hire one yourself.

• You have the right to be represented by a lawyer, even if you cannot afford to hire one yourself.
• You have the right to request a reasonable bond.
• You have a right to a speedy trial. You have a right to a predimary examination on any felony charge brought against you. If you must be tried within 180 days.
• While in police custody, you get to make at least one phone call.
