Oakland County's Board of Commissioners must approve money to pay for the citizens grand Jury investigation. It will cost an estimated \$50,000 for six months, Thompson said.

AREA POLICE agencies voiced their support for a grand jury probe carlier this year when Thompson angested the plan to fight. The drug was a support they saw a 19 percent increase in drug-related arreits and a 26 percent increase in the selurue of cocaine in 1988 as compared to 1987.

"Drug distribution networks operating in Oakland County," Thompson asid, "especially those with common ethnic or neighborhood ties, are no-circusly unwilling to cooperate with law enforcement and these groups

A citizens grand jury, selected like A citizens grand jury, selected like any other jury, can compel witnesses to appear and testify in a secret hearing. It can offer lesser drug dealers immunity to testify against higher-level dealers and, if they refuse to testify, can charge them with contempt and put them in jail.

THOMPSON SAID his office would combine with the U.S. Attorney's office to provide a "full-court press" against drug dealers. Assistant prosecutor Lawrence Bunding would coordinate the grand jury investigation team, which will include other assistant prosecutor Jeffrey Butter, Charles Senchena and Michael Sheridan prosecutors Jeffrey Butter, Charles Senchena and Michael Sheridah about 60 days of approval, Thompson said.
