There are now more than 50 singers. He conducts everything

from Bach to boogle.

His mixed group of singers from all walks of life is perhaps best known for spirituals. He will lead Cantata's Eight European Tour this summer for 14 performances in Germany, Austria, Poland and Czechoslovakia.
