

Primroges hardly ever set seed because of the shape of the flowers.
Bees can't reach into the blossoms for enough to pollinate. If Kalmbach wants the flowers to set seed, she

hand pollinates with a little brush using two different plants.

The pollen is taken from one plant and put on the plant that is to set seed. Cheese cloth is gently put over the flower to keep beer from disturbing them and the ants from stealing the seeds. Seeds are as Uny, they look like powder. When they are harvested, they are plut into a nervelope for acid-keeping and set aside to dry for a couple of months. Fresh seeds are necessary for successful germination. That's why the ones from England may not work.


Kalmbach starts seeds in September because of the time it takes to realize a plant. Everything must be sterile. Soil is sterilized (she does her own by baking it at 200 degrees for 2-3 bours) and put in a clean square plastic four hen pat which has been rinsed in bleach.


At this stage the loose, cooled soil is dry, seeds are sprinkled on top and the pot set in water so that soil can be wet from below. This also pulls the seeds down into the soil. The pots are misted for three days with water at 120 degrees and then two days with 110 degrees water. The hot water takes the place of freezing the seeds, as is often recommended, and helps break the bard shell.






