But there's no telling the Cardinals' High team that the extra point is automatic.

If it were, West at least would have gained it against Riverside Friday. As it was, Riverside capitalized on a point-after and gained a 7-6 victory in a Tri River League game.

Star back Jerry LaCross, who carried 82 yards in 12 tries, had suffered a fractured collarbone. He'll be lost for the year.

West goes against Cherry Hill Friday.

It'll be a battle of two teams in the same boat. Cherry Hill also is 0-3 so far.

Trojans Correct Mistakes, Gain 6-0 Loop Win
