Carl E; Licht, president of the society, said the move will supplement the annual Easter Seal Appeal, making possible an extension of services to the rippled children and adults in the area.

"Termination of the special education program based at the Easter Seal Center for the past live years, sponsored by the linkster School District and the other districts from which the students were referred, has been a real blow to multiple handicapped teen-agers," Licht said.

"ALTHOUGH ALTERNATE school placements have been found to meet the academic needs of most of the young people formerly enrolled in this special program, we must remember that the reasons for considering a special program in the first place remain.
