

Ecumenism At Home

Lutherans, Catholics In 2-Day Dialogue

Lutheran and Catholic neighbors are being urged to get together in car pools to attend a two-day Lutheran-Roman Catholic Dialogue on Tuesday, Oct. 8, and Wednesday, Oct. 9.

"Ecumenism begins best at home," said a spokesman for the conference. "The dialogues in the cars on the way to and from the meeting may be as important as what is said from the platform."

A modern Catholic view of the Reformation on Tuesday at 8 p.m. and a Lutheran view of the Vatican Council on Wednesday at 8 p.m., will highlight the evening sessions, which are designed to appeal especially to the laity.

CO-CHAIRMAN will be Dr. John F. Chitt, president of Michigan Lutheran College, who will preside when Catholics are speaking, and the Right Rev. Albert Matry, who will take the chair when Lutherans are at the microphone.

The evening sessions, open to the public, will be in Ford Auditorium, with a \$1 charge each night. Morning and afternoon sessions on both days, intended chiefly for the clergy and others interested in theology, will be in the Veterans' Memorial Building. A charge of \$1 for each of these sessions also will be made.

The Rev. Father John W. McAlvey, S.J., S.T.D., will size up the Reformation on the opening evening. A history professor at the University of Detroit, Father O'Malley took his Ph.D. degree in history at Harvard University and has studied at its Renaissance Center in Florence, Italy, as well as in the American Academy in Rome. His studies of Renaissance patterns of thought have been widely published.

"A Lutheran Appraisal of Vatican II," will be presented by the Dr. Oswald Hoffman, widely known to the nation as a popular Lutheran Hour speaker. Dr. Hoffman has his headquarters in the Lutheran Layman's League in St. Louis, Missouri. The depth of his studies of the implications of Christendom in the four constitutions, nine decrees and three declarations resulting from the Vatican Council has won him international attention.

THE TUESDAY, Oct. 8, morning session will open at 9:30 a.m. with Dr. Ralph Bohmann, of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, presenting a Lutheran view of "The World of God as the Rule of Faith" and the Rev. Father Robert Wernski, of SS. Cyril and Methodius Seminary, Orchard Lake, a Catholic view.

At 2 p.m. an examination of "The Nature of the Church" will be made by the Rev. Father Theodore M. Crono, of St. John's Provincial Seminary, Plymouth, and the Rev. James J. Schaal of the Evangelical Lutheran Theological Seminary at Columbus, O.

Rabbi LeBurkien Is Student Of The World

Two young men who are the new spiritual leaders of Livonia's Temple Beth Am are students who commute several hundred miles to their jobs.

Both Rabbi Michael LeBurkien, who recently finished conducting High Holy Day services for the Jewish Reformed congregation, and Rabbi Steve Chester are students at Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati.

They take turns driving to Livonia to conduct service for Temple Beth Am each weekend.

Rabbi LeBurkien, like many young men now entering spiritual service to reform Judaism, came to this profession by a long route and has trained himself thoroughly for it.

He is a 1958 graduate of Indiana University, where he was named to Phi Beta Kappa, and has studied international relations at the University of Wisconsin and Johns Hopkins University. He also has gone into French civilization at the University of Paris, and been a

student at the school of foreign service at Bologna, Italy. Work in social service also is part of his background.

DECIDING FINALLY to become a rabbi and enroll in the Hebrew Union College, LeBurkien decided that to be effective in the profession he had to learn Hebrew in its Biblical, Middle Age and Modern usages.

That meant study in the United States in Jerusalem, so that was where he headed in the spring of 1967.

"The cultural change from New York City to Israel was fantastic," he related. "But I found I could get wonderful instruction in Hebrew. For \$8 a day on a house I was studying with some of the top scholars in the land."

Rabbi LeBurkien quickly grew to love the land and its people, and found himself participating wholeheartedly in the celebration that marked Independence Day on May 15.

That festive spirit was silenced suddenly when word came that Nasser had moved his forces into the Sinai area, Rabbi LeBurkien said.

"PEOPLE THINK of the war as beginning June 6," he said. "Really, the start was May 15, and from that moment the is-

rael economy ground to a halt. Many foreign visitors left, but LeBurkien and other students chose to stay. Since he had some knowledge of French, he was asked to teach in a French school which had its Israeli staff drafted for army service.

It was quite a chore to deal in French eight hours a day, he remembers, "but the kids were fine and it was a good experience."

LeBurkien and his fellow students had a close-up view of the six-day war, he said, because their college was located close to the Jordanian border. They watched a lot of the action, and saw the people rush out of their homes when the Star of David was raised on the Tower of David.

IT WAS the aftermath of the six-day war that interested this observer the most.

He was in Israel four more months, and found it fascinating to see the Jewish and Arab nationals meet in the captured old city and learn to live together.

"People found jobs and places to live and there really was no refugee problem," he said. "Peace in that area will have to come with the people themselves working it out."

Rabbi LeBurkien, who lived in Detroit during part of his boyhood, is enjoying returning to the area with his service to Beth Am.
