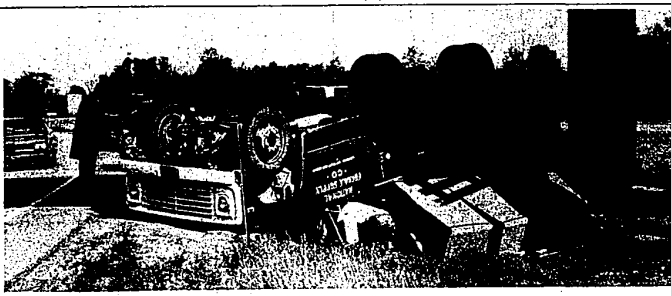
St. Fabian's Women's Council

Resisting Arrest Charged After Ride

Farmington Township Justice Byron Walter has remanded a township man for Circuit Court trial for resisting arrest from a township police officer. Arraignment has been set for Oct. 9 before Judge William J. Bauer.

Walter I. Velowich, 38, of 28735 W. 10 Mile Rd., was arrested June 28 for careless driving and resisting arrest with force.

Patrolman John Hedrick, a six-month veteran of the township police and a former Highland Park officer, told Justice Walter at the Sept. 20 examination that he had seen Velowich driving west on the south side of Middle Belt Rd. near 10 Mile with a child in the scope of a farm tractor.

Police records indicate that Hedrick cautioned Velowich about "transporting the child in such a manner" and that when Velowich "became argumentative and walked away" he was placed under arrest. Velowich has been released on \$50 appeal bond on the careless driving charges and \$250 continued bond on the resisting arrest charges. He did not testify during the examination.
