Program dates and speakers are:

Oct. 15 — "In the Lapps of the Gods" with Bengt Swenson, of Franklin, owner of Skandia House, architect, designer and specialist in "Vital Design." Also an author, his book, "The Other Side of Franklin," will be released in November. He has just returned from assignments in Sweden and England.

Nov. 19 — "The Detroit Area in 2000 A.D." with Wilbur Pierce, communications director for Developing Urban Detroit Area Research Project. A resident of Bloomfield Hills and Detroit Edison employee, Pierce has been a guest lecturer at the University of Wisconsin and Michigan State and is the author of many works on management, purchasing and personnel.

Jan. 14 — "Incomparable Switzerland" with Phil Walker,

freelance photographer and travel film lecturer. Walker flew in a free-floating balloon across the Alps, and the story of the flight was presented in National Geographic magazine. He has been an actor, director and writer for NBC.

Feb. 18 — "E.S.P. and YOU" with Mr. and Mrs. Richard Eubank. For many years, the Eubanks have studied extrasensory perception and conduct a meditation session in their Bloomfield Hills home once a week. They have appeared on the Lou Gordon show and have spoken before Rotary, Masonic and school groups. Eubank is past president of the Association to Advance Ethical Hypnosis.

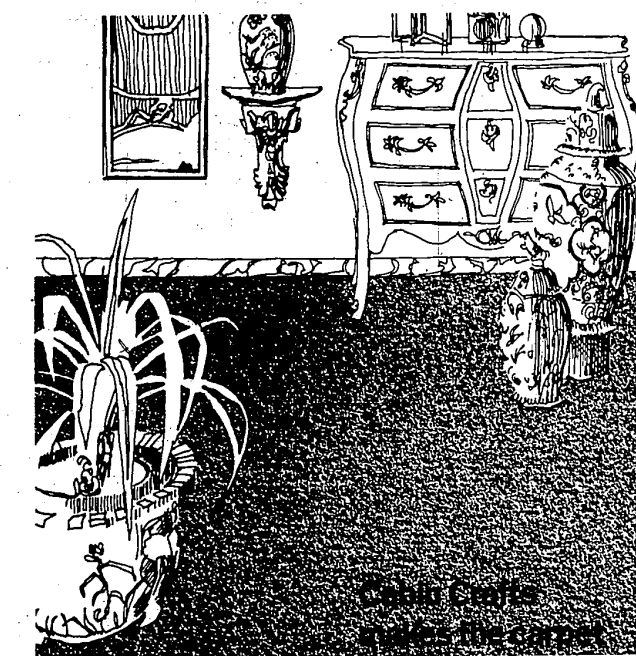
