Two sets of planets 'meet' during July

This month there will be two conjunctions ("meetings") of planets in the sky. Mercury will appear to pass Jupiter and Venus will appear to poss Mars. In addition, Earth is far-beautiff of the state of the state of the work of the meteor abover, albeit a weak one.

The amount of sunlight we receive decreases by 65 minutes this month. On July 1, sanrise is at 5:59 a.m. and sunset is at 1:21 p.m.; allowing for a possible 15 hours and 13 minutes of sunlight. On July 31 these times are 6:24 a.m. and 9:52 p.m., for a possible 14 hours and 28 minutes of sun.

The evening planets this month are Venus, Mars and Saturn. Mercury and Jupiter are in the predawn

ry and Jupiter are in the predawn sky, You might be able to glimpse Mer-cury early in July. Face toward the east northeastern horizon about 45 ites before sunrise, and locate waning ("fading") crescent

moon. Mercury will be six degrees below the moon, and only three degrees above the horizon. Obviously an unobstructed view of the horizon will be necessary to see Mercury. About two degrees to the north (left) of Mercury is Jupiter.

Jupiter also will be difficult to see; It's only two degrees above the horizon. By the end of the month, Jupiter will be much higher in the morning sky and very easy to see; it's only two degrees above the horizon. Also on July 2, Saturn is at opposi-tion. It will be opposite the sun as seen from the earth. Saturn will rise in the southeast as the sun sets in the northwest, be visible all night, and set in the southwest as the sun rises in the northeast.

New Moon occurs at 12:59 a.m. on July 3. The moon is located between the earth and the sun. This could also be considered a conjunction between the sun and the moon, although the moon is not visible.

Earth is at aphellon on July 4.

EARTH'S ORBIT around the sun EARTH'S ORBIT around the sun is not a circle. It is elliptical (oval). In July, when we have warm weather, we are farthest from the sun. We are actually closest to the sun in January. Our distance to the sun does not determine our seasons. It is the direction of the tilt of the earth's

poles, with respect to the sun, that governs the scasons. Look for the wazing ("growing") crescent moon on the evening of the 4th. Face west porthwest 58 minutes after sunset. The bright "star" inmediately to the left of the upper cust gooint of the crescent) is Venus. Extend a line from the cust phrough Venus and you'll come to the red planet, Mars. 
