It couldn't get any better for as-piring pro-golfer Agim Bardha of Birmingham.

over 50) and made \$10,000 this year,
compared to \$44,000 (officially) last
year, which was enough to cover
\$30,000 worth of expenses and buy
a few new golf balls.

STILL, HE'S NOT complaining. Bardha considers himself to be very fortunate to be in America, doing the two things he loves most — running his own salon and playing golf. He says he could have been "tending sheep" in his native Albania instead.


