THE KNIGHTS fell behind early, trailed by 11 points halfway through the fourth quarter and, even when they scored to make it close with four minutes lett, victory appeared unlikely. But the unlinetational on-side kick was the difference between a winning and losing season.

"To tell you the truth, I didn't see the kick-off," sald Kefgen, who watched the game from the Silverdome press box and was stuck in an elevator heading towards the playing field when Labser got its big break.

"When (Andwer) scored I thought it was all over for us. But it was a great thrill the way we came back," he said. "To come back from two
