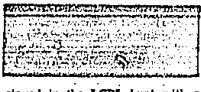


Hines Park shares lead with Caesars in LCBL

Both teams are 14-4 going into the all-star break with nine games left to play. Hines Park leads the season series, 6-2.

Dorkowal, a Plymouth Canton High product and starter at Michigan State University, struck out four and walked only one in raising his record to 6-1. All three runs were earned as left-hander lowered his league-leading earned run average to 1.15.

"Dark" was on top of his game," said Hines Park coach Dave Racer. "He threw a great game for us. He was mixing his pitches very well."

Jim Miller, the Waterloo/Kettering All-Stater headed for MSU as a quarterback this fall, took the loss for Caesars. He allowed all four runs in 5 2/3 innings of work.

Hines Park tallied the winning run in the sixth when Dennis Szczecowski walked, advanced to second on a walk, took third on a wild pitch and scored on a John Bonham's fielders choice.

Szczecowski, Bill Bannon and Mike Culver each had RBI singles for the winners.

Steve Malagay had two hits in a losing cause while Tim Napier added an RBI.

Tennis star has ups, downs

A busy summer it's been for Kori Davidson, the 16-year-old Farmington Hills tennis star who celebrated her sophomore year at Harrison. But the news hasn't been all good.

A week after winning her first tournament of the season, Davidson exited in the quarterfinals of the prestigious Top Gun Tournament at Bloomfield Open Hunt Club. Katie Nederveel of Grand Rapids knocked Davidson out with a 7-6, 6-3 win.

Nicole Tronzo, another Farmington Hills resident, also fell in the quarterfinals 6-0, 6-3 to Candy Kopselak of Sterling Heights.

The results had been much better for Davidson a week earlier. For the third consecutive year, she reached the finals of the Western Closed Tennis Championships in Indianapolis, this time in the 16-and-under age division. And for the first time, Davidson emerged with a title, beating Sherri Bash of Columbus, Ohio, 4-6, 6-4, 6-4 in the June 29 final.

IT WAS a sweet victory for Davidson, ranked third in the West in her age group (Bash is seventh). Last year, Bash beat Davidson for the Western 16-and-under title. It took seven matches and a lot of vitamin C - Davidson was battling the flu early in the tournament - to claim the title. She whipped Marija Neubauer of Rochester 6-3, 7-6 (7-2 in the tiebreaker) in the quarterfinals, then ousted Stacey Starratt of Chicago 6-3, 9-6, 6-2 in the semis.

Davidson also reached the finals in doubles, but she and partner Alisa Kim of Evansville, Ind., were beaten by Bash and Holly Lord of Indianapolis 6-1, 7-6 (7-4 tiebreaker).

The tournament title has made Davidson's schedule even more hectic. Her next stop is the U.S. Hardcourt Nationals in San Jose, Calif., July 9-15, followed by trips to the National Clay Court Championships in Virginia Beach, Va., July 20-27; the 18-and-under Intersections in Atlanta, July 28 to Aug. 2, and the USTA Sweet 16 Nationals in West Virginia Aug. 7-14.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING CONCERNING PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT AT DETROIT METROPOLITAN WAYNE COUNTY AIRPORT

A public hearing will be held on August 9, 1989, from 3 p.m. to approximately 11 p.m. at the Ramada Inn in Romulus (off Netherland Road at 8270 Wickham Road).

The purpose of this hearing is to consider the economic, social and environmental effects of the proposed Master Plan development and Noise Compatibility Plan at Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport.
