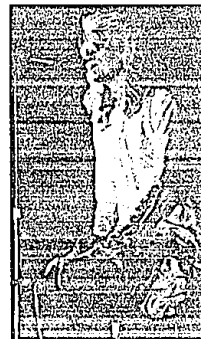

Community interest in the pageant has improved, D'Ascenzo said, but she hopes to see more participation with preparation of the pageant in the future.

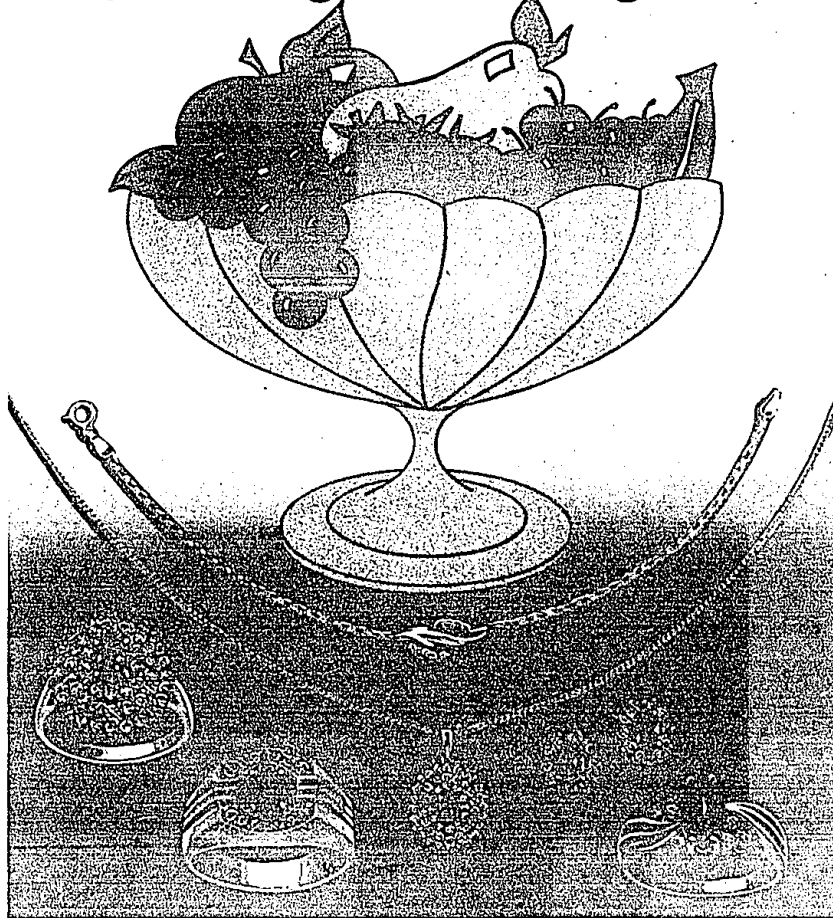
