

Does that sound ordinary? When Meagher related her experiences with the pressure surrounding the Olympic Games to a bunch of kids by saying "To me, it was no different than it was when I won my first national (event) when I was 10" — who could possibly identify? How many will even compete at a national meet, let alone win at one?

These are two athletes who experienced a greater degree of success by the time they were teenagers than most of their audience will in a lifetime. As Meagher admitted, winning motivated her.

While success may not have come easily to them, there's no denying it came more often. Certainly more often than the average person experiences.

SO THERE was precious little the kids in the crowd could actually relate to, at least on a comparable athletic level. The gap separating the crowd and the Olympians was all the difference between an Escort and a Ferrari.

Even their advice on technique was too brief to be really useful. As Meagher said, "They may learn a few technical things, but I'd never take credit for a future butterflyer. I don't expect to do miracles."

That's why their mere appearance outweighed anything they said or did. That's what made the gamble of bringing them into Detroit a good one for the NSSL and Sitgrays.

A sport like swimming desperately needs ambassadors. It needs people like Meagher and Berkoff — and Rowdy Galines, who appeared briefly
