

# Woodside, Beech Wood coin pool wins

Woodside Athletic Club improved its record to 5-0 on the season last week with a 343-234 victory over visiting Cranbrook Swim Club in Northwest Suburban Swim League action.

Jenny Vanker sparked the winners, winning the 50 free in the girls 9-10 division in a pool record time of 31.70.

Woodside was also paced by six swimmers with two individual victories each. In the 7-8 division, Vimal Abatemarco took top honors in the 25 free (19.07) and the 25 fly (20.49). Hope Vandenberg won the 50 free (31.76) in the 11-12 division then swam up in the 13-14 division and captured first place in the 50 breaststroke (40.24). Tim Stallkamp turned the same trick, winning the 100 IM (1:19.79) in the 11-12 division and the 50 fly (34.72) in the 13-14 division.

Also in the 13-14 division, Lix Huckabay picked up a pair of victories, winning the 50 fly (31.68) and the 50 free (28.72), while Jenny Williams won the 100 IM (1:19.47) in the 13-14 division and the 50 back (34.97) in the 15-17 division.

Amy Jarchow was the other double-winner for Woodside, winning the 100 free (1:05.20) and the 50 fly (33.35) in the 15-17 division.

Woodside featured 20 single-event winners and won five of six relays. Woodside won the 40-year mixed free relay, the 40-year mixed medley relay, the 52-year girls medley relay, the 52-year boys medley relay and the 64-year girls free relay.
