

# Farmington's new traffic board takes shape

Farmington's newly formed Traffic and Safety Board now has a complement of seven members and is ready to deal with traffic concerns in the city.

Five of the members are Farmington residents and voting members of the board; the remaining two will be non-voting advisory members representing the city.

The city council July 17 appointed four at-large members, who will join three previously appointed members on the board.

The city council formed the traffic board this year, following continued interest from a group of residents concerned with traffic in their residential area downtown.

A NUMBER of people were interviewed for the at-large positions in June. New members of the board include:

• Bill McCullough — an at-large

member who will serve a three-year term. A resident of Farmington for six years, McCullough is a manager with AAA Michigan in Dearborn. He has also worked in personnel, sales and customer service. He lives on Schulte Street.

• Duane Reynolds — an at-large member who will serve a two-year term. A resident of Lee Lane, Reynolds has lived in the city since 1977. He is a former police officer with the Farmington Hills Police Department and is now an attorney with the Farmington Hills firm of Larson, Harms & Wright.

• Ken Chiara — an at-large member who will serve a two-year term. Chiara lives in the city's historic Old Village area and encouraged the city to form the traffic board. He is concerned with traffic issues in residential areas of the city. An architectural engineer, he lives on Shilwa Street.

• Tom Stumpo — an at-large member who will serve a one-year

term. He is a resident of Valley View.

• Earl Baumunk — a representative of the Farmington Public Schools who will serve a three-year term. Baumunk is the director of vocational and career education for the district, and also handles safety issues and concerns within the district. Baumunk lives on Maple in Farmington.

• Frank Lauboff — the city's director of public safety, who will sit on the board as a city representative. He is a non-voting member.

• Robert DeCorte — a traffic en-

gineer with the Traffic Improvement Association of Oakland County,

will serve as a city representative. He is also a non-voting member.

City Manager Robert Deadman said Lauboff will likely call a preliminary meeting of the new board, at which time members can establish bylaws and regular meeting dates.

Also July 17, the council appointed a new member to the city's Board of Zoning Appeals and another to the Planning Commission. Appointed to the BZA was Mayfield Street resident Steve Bergstrom. Keane Peterson, a resident of Hillview Court, is a new member of the Planning Commission.
