McDonald's employee ordered to stand trial

The day of the robbery was Shavers' day off. He worked as scheduled the next day, showing no unusual behavior, police said. Shavers, being held in lieu of \$500,000 bond, will be arraigned before Circuit Judge Gene Schnitz Monday, Aug. 21.

Arraigned in district court July 13, Shavers pleaded innocent to eight felony counts: two counts of assault with intent to commit murder, single counts of armed robbery and felonious assault and four counts of possessing a firearm while committing a felony.

DOUGLAS LEE Parks, 18, of Farmington Hills, a friend of Shavers who police believe drove the getaway car, pleaded innocent to one count of armed robbery. He waived his right to a preliminary examination and is being held on \$100,000 bond pending arraignment today before Schnitz.

Steve Wilson, 18, of Farmington Hills, suspected of hiding some of the stolen money, pleaded innocent to one count of accessory after the fact to a felony and one count of receiving and concealing stolen property over \$100. Free on \$10,000 personal recognizance

bond, he also waived his right to a preliminary examination. He'll also be arraigned before Schnitz today.

Richard was not available for the first day of the preliminary examination on July 27. At that time, a friend of Shavers and Parks, Charles Constantine, 18, testified the two men admitted robbing the store.

Constantine also said Parks told him Shavers fired a shot because employees thought the robbery was a joke.

McDonald's employee John Pelegrino and armored truck courier Eric Anderson quit the day of the robbery.

Pelegrino was working outside near the trash compactor when a man wearing a mask and an Army jacket appeared with a gun. Pelegrino said he assumed the gun was a toy. He tried to grab the gun, but the gunman jerked away and ordered him to kneel and face the compactor until he retreated.

A tip from a resident who saw a news broadcast describing the getaway car led police to the homes of Parks and Shavers, who were arrested July 11-12. Wilson was arrested July 13.

Shavers and Parks face up to life in prison if convicted. Wilson faces up to five years in prison if convicted.

DRUGS AS THE CAUSE OF ARTHRITIS
Arthritis can develop as the result of infections, accidents, heredity, and altered immunity. Not so well known is the fact that arthritis can arise as a side effect of medication.
For example: hydralazine, a drug used to treat high blood pressure, and procaine amide, drug used to stop abnormal heart rhythm, can cause a joint condition that mimics Lupus arthritis. The possible side effect of a medication useful in decreasing cholesterol and serum triglyceride levels, gemfibrozil, includes muscle and tendon aches that can be incapacitating.
Why medication produces such side effects is not completely understood. In some instances, the body makes antibodies against the drug. These antibodies have an affinity for the tissues in the joints and tendons; once attached to the joints these antibodies set off an inflammatory reaction.
The treatment of medicine-induced arthritis is to stop the offending drug. No other treatment will suffice. Thus, when you see a doctor about joint pain, be prepared to tell not only the medicine used to treat your joints, but include all the medication you have taken in the last six months.
