But they're willing to change things. They're looking at the floor plan. They're getting the shell. They want to know if the bathroom is in good condition. They want the house to be in good condition so they won't have to buy a furnace after they move in," Jacobson said.

BUYERS WHO BUILD a house are less likely to settle for second best. Instead, they're demanding more luxury ltems and larger homes than their parents. That can mean anything from an entirely brick exterior to imported kitchen cabinets, according to Bonadeo.

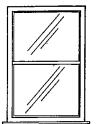
