The following actions were taken by City Council:

A pre-bid meeting will be held at 10:00 A.M. for the mechanical & electrical trades, the architectural trades and equipment vendors pre-bid will be held at 1:30 P.M. Attendance is strongly recommended.

Proposals may be mailed or delivered in person to the Lewis Shulman Administration Center, 32500 Shilawassee, Farmington, MI 48024, Attn: Beverly Hausman. Proposals must be received "in person" to 4:00 P.M. (local time) on August 22, 1989. Proposals will be opened publicly and read aloud at the Board Meeting at 7:30 P.M. All bids will be evaluated at a later date.

The Project will utilize separate prime contracts. All contracts for construction will be direct contracts with the Owner. Overall coordination of the Project will be the responsibility of the construction management firm, McCarthy & Smith, Inc./E&V, Incorporated — a Joint Venture.

The Owner will award contracts on critical items or about August 29, 1989, to separate Contractors for separate Bid Divisions or combinations of bid divisions. Any Bidder, at his option, may submit a combined Proposal for any combination of Bid Divisions by offering a Combined Bid Deduct. A separate Bid must be submitted for each Bid Division included in any such combined Proposal.

All Project procedures and documents are designed to facilitate delivery of the Project through multiple prime construction contracts. The Owner's forms, rather than industry master forms, are used for all documents. Bidders shall read and review the Bidding Documents carefully, and shall familiarize themselves thoroughly with all requirements.

Requests by Contractors for inclusion as bidders shall be addressed to the Construction Manager. One set of Bidding Documents will be provided free of charge to bidders. The Bidding Documents will be provided free of charge to bidders. The Bidding Documents are on file for inspection at the Architect's office. A \$40.00 document replacement charge will be assessed only if the Documents are not returned to the Project Team in good and usable condition.
