3 sidewalk projects OK'd; hearing set on another

Three sidewalks have been added to Farmington Hills' 1939-90 sidewalk construction program and a fourth is proposed.
Monday night, the city council approved sidewalks for:

• Nine Mile, south side, Gill to Farmington Road, \$70,000.

• 13 Mile, north side, Fox Club to Tanglewood, \$15,000.

A sidewalk is proposed for Farmington Road, from 12 Mile to 13 Mile, to 13 Mile, at a cost of \$110,000.

Residents have asked for sidewalks along these stretches of Farmington Road, Nine Mile and 13 Mile.


