

Drug-free T-shirt program nears goal

With \$10,000 donation from Hills, sponsor is only \$5,000 short

Farmington Hills donated another \$10,000 to "Drug Free T-shirt Day," scheduled for Friday, Oct. 6, in the Farmington Public Schools.

As of Tuesday, the day's sponsoring agency, Farmington Families In Action, had received \$25,000 in donations, still \$5,000 short of its \$30,000 goal.

It was believed the Hills donation made Monday would take the group to its goal, but Tuesday, it was dis-

covered that was not the case. On the drug awareness day, as part of National Substance Abuse Awareness Month, 12,500 students, faculty and staff members are scheduled to receive a T-shirt that will have the "Say yes to life, say no drugs" logo to kick off the community program.

Monday's action by the Farmington Hills City Council takes the city's total program donations to \$15,000,

using money from the city's drug forfeiture account. Cash or property seized in drug raids or from those arrested on drug offenses must be used for drug education and enforcement.

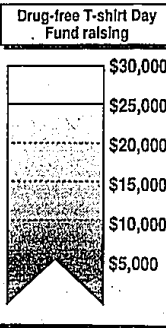
The city of Farmington donated \$800 from its drug forfeiture account, and the Farmington Public Schools gave \$5,000 from the district's community services account, matching the original donation made

by the Hills. Other donations were made by PTAs, PTOs, school booster clubs and other community groups and businesses.

FARMINGTON HILLS Mayor Terry Sever had originally suggested a \$15,000 donation from the city. The city's drug forfeiture account currently has \$80,000, with some money earmarked for police enforcement, said police Chief William Dwyer. Anyone wishing to make a tax-de-

Families In Action is also planning a four-week series called "Are You Concerned?" on Oct. 3, 10, 18 and 25 at Harrison High School, where representatives from Maplegrove Alcoholism Chemical Dependency Treatment Center in West Bloomfield will discuss such topics as disease, family, teen-agers and intervention.



Local woman named to exchange program

Sherry Burns of Farmington has been appointed community counselor for the new Au Pair in America program, sponsored by the American Institute For Foreign Study Scholarship Foundation of Greenwich, Conn.

The foundation has been designated by the U.S. Government as the first organization to sponsor a cultural exchange/child care opportunity.

Burns has experience in personnel and with foreign students. At her new position, Burns will supervise the Au Pairs, young British and English speaking Europeans who are in the Farmington area to participate in a cultural exchange program by living with host families and assisting with their child care needs.

Burns will also interview prospective host families, organize cultural

functions, and counsel the 20-30 Au Pairs who will be living with the host families for one year.

The foundation, a non profit, educational exchange organization that has been involved in youth exchange since 1967, provides an orientation, medical insurance and facilities educational opportunities for the Au Pairs. The foundation is an affiliate of AIFS Inc., a publicly owned com-

pany which provides program services for the foundation.
