Philip Arnold, Challenging them are Jonathan Grant, Vernon Kielpinski, Lawrence Lichtman, Ronald Oliverio, Albert Rosen, Bettye Stines and George Sarkisian.

Among these 10, voters may vote for up to four. The top three votegetters in the Nov. 7 general election will earn four-year terms; the next highest finisher will serve a two-year term.

Nancy Bates and Herbert Liner are challenging incumbent Paul Sowerby in the race to fill the re-maining two years of former coun-cilman Joe Alkateeb's four-year term. Sowerby was appointed in

March to replace Alkatech until the next city election.

Council members are paid \$1,800 per year. They meet the second, third and fourth Mondays of each month, and hold many special meetings.

Thirteen candidates is the largest field in the city's 16-year history. The deadline to register to vote is Oct. 10.
